(1) An acknowledgement that the institution signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used the applicable amount of funds designated under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

Bryan College of Health Sciences (BCHS) signed and submitted the Recipient's Funding Certification and Agreement for the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act and by drawing down funds from American Rescue Plan Act (ARP), agrees to the conditions of each of these programs and assures that BCHS will use the applicable amount of funds designated under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

(2) The total amount of funds that the institution will receive or has received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.

BCHS has received \$666,819 in student aid funds under ARP (a)(4).

(3) The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs as of the date of submission (i.e., as of the initial report and every calendar quarter thereafter).

As of the September 30, 2021 BCHS has distributed \$505,471 in ARP funds.

The estimated student's eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants under ARP is 870.

The total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students is 616 under ARP (a)(1).

(6) The method(s) used by the institution to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.

## **ARP**

To be eligible for ARP funds, students must have been enrolled in a degree, non-degree or certificate program in the spring 2021 and/or summer 2021 academic terms.

- Below is the methodology used to calculate Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students for housing under ARP for the spring 2021
  - Students with an EFC of less than 5,000 and enrolled in a degree program in the spring 2021 term is eligible to receive an \$1,350 grant
  - Students with an EFC of 5,000-10,000 and enrolled in a degree program in the spring 2021 term is eligible to receive an \$900 grant
  - Students with an EFC of 10,001-15,000 and enrolled in a degree program in the spring 2021 term is eligible to receive an \$450 grant
  - Students with an EFC of more than 15,000 and enrolled in a degree program in the spring 2021 term is eligible to receive an \$180 grant
  - Students with an EFC of less than 5,000 and enrolled in a non-degree program in the spring 2021 term is eligible to receive an \$450 grant
  - Students with an EFC of 5,000-10,000 and enrolled in a non-degree program in the spring 2021 term is eligible to receive an \$360 grant
  - Students with an EFC of 10,001-15,000 and enrolled in a non-degree program in the spring 2021 term is eligible to receive an \$270 grant
  - Students with an EFC of more than 15,000 and enrolled in a non-degree program in the spring 2021 term is eligible to receive an \$180 grant
- Below is the methodology used to calculate Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students for food, technology, healthcare and housing under ARP for the summer 2021
  - Students with an EFC of less than 5,000 and enrolled in a degree program in the summer 2021 term is eligible to receive an \$1,640 grant
  - Students with an EFC of 5,000-10,000 and enrolled in a degree program in the summer 2021 term is eligible to receive an \$1,093 grant
  - Students with an EFC of 10,001-15,000 and enrolled in a degree program in the summer 2021 term is eligible to receive an \$547 grant
  - Students with an EFC of more than 15,000 and enrolled in a degree program in the summer 2021 term is eligible to receive an \$219 grant
  - Students with an EFC of less than 5,000 and enrolled in a degree program in the summer 2021, but not taking classes during in the summer 2021 term, is eligible to receive an \$820 grant

- Students with an EFC of 5,000-10,000 and enrolled in a degree program in the summer 2021, but not taking classes during the summer 2021 term, is eligible to receive an \$547 grant
- Students with an EFC of 10,001-15,000 and enrolled in a degree program in the summer 2021, but not taking classes during the summer 2021 term, is eligible to receive an \$273 grant
- Students with an EFC of more than 15,000 and enrolled in a degree program in the summer 2021, but not taking classes during the summer 2021 term, is eligible to receive an \$109 grant
- Students with an EFC of less than 5,000 and enrolled in a non-degree program in the summer 2021 term is eligible to receive an \$383 grant
- Students with an EFC of 5,000-10,000 and enrolled in a non-degree program in the summer 2021 term is eligible to receive an \$306 grant
- Students with an EFC of 10,001-15,000 and enrolled in a non-degree program in the summer 2021 term is eligible to receive an \$230 grant
- Students with an EFC of more than 15,000 and enrolled in a non-degree program in the summer 2021 term is eligible to receive an \$153 grant
- Students with an EFC of less than 5,000 and enrolled in a non-degree program in the summer 2021, but not taking classes during in the summer 2021 term, is eligible to receive an \$221 grant
- Students with an EFC of 5,000-10,000 and enrolled in a non-degree program in the summer 2021, but not taking classes during the summer 2021 term, is eligible to receive an \$177 grant
- Students with an EFC of 10,001-15,000 and enrolled in a non-degree program in the summer 2021, but not taking classes during the summer 2021 term, is eligible to receive an \$132 grant
- Students with an EFC of more than 15,000 and enrolled in a non-degree program in the summer 2021,
  but not taking classes during the summer 2021 term, is eligible to receive an \$88 grant

(7) Any instructions, directions, or guidance provided by the institution to students concerning the Emergency Financial Aid Grants.

Students received communication from BCHS's Financial Aid Department via text and email notifying them of the opportunity to receive Emergency Student Grants. Financial Aid's ongoing communications guided eligible students to a process where they could accept these grant funds. These communications included guidance on how to apply for Additional Emergency Grant Assistance.
